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HISTORY OF SREE KERALA VARMA COLLEGE

At a time when the existing colleges in Thrissur were not adequate to meet the requirements of the student population who were desirous of higher education, strong public demand and enthusiasm of some prominent citizens prompted the formation of a committee to consider establishing new centre of learning. His Highness Sree Kerala Varma, the Maharajah of Cochin was happy about the idea and sanctioned a grant of one lakh rupees and a loan of five lakh rupees (later converted as grant) and sufficient timber for the construction of buildings.

Further he allotted the 'Merry Lodge Palace' the residence of 'RAJARSHI' Sri. Ramavarma, the abdicated Maharajah of Kochi who was in power till 1932 and the surrounding greenery to make abode for this centre of learning. The College was named 'Sree Kerala Varma College' after the founder, H.H. Sree Kerala Varma. The golden words inscribed on the 'Merry Lodge Palace' "Pure be my life forever" became the motto of the college to commemorate the principles of the former occupant of the palace.

In a royal message on 8th February 1949 the Maharajah of Cochin states..... "To the people of Cochin this institution will be something more than a mere college. To them it will ever remain a temple of learning, a sacred monument carrying with it the happy memory of His Highness Late. Sri. Rama Varma, the abdicated Maharajah of Cochin, my revered uncle and Guru. For, it was on this hallowed spot surrounded by smiling fields and winding roads, in the midst of shady parks and scented flowers that the 'Maker of Modern Cochin' that scholar king, lived the peaceful life of a true 'Rajarshi' after his retirement. No better site could have been chosen to establish this sacred temple of Learning".

Later the Committee was sanctioned authority by the name and style of "Sree Kerala Varma College Senatus" by an order of Sree Kerala Varma Maharajah of Cochin in 1123 (M.E.) (1947-48).

8. The Principal, Sree Kerala Varma College and one nominee of the Madras University were ex-officio members.

The college was affiliated to the then Madras University with none other than Kavithilakam Prof. P. Sankaran Nambiar at the helm as Principal. He was then, the Principal of Maharajah's college and member of Syndicate of the Madras University. The College was officially inaugurated on the 11th of August 1947, by admitting its first student, Miss V.K. Malathy.

Intermediate and B.A. Junior courses were started in 1947. In 1948, B.Com and B.A. (Music) courses were added. A course in music was to be started for the first time in Kerala in this college. But in 1952-53 the course in music was terminated. Courses in Science were started in 1953-54. The first post graduate courses commenced in 1965. M.A. (English) and M.A. (Economics) were the first P.G. Courses in this college.

Meanwhile the management of the college went through various stages of transition. Though the committee got the Authority of Maharajah of Cochin as "Sree Kerala Varma College Senatus" in 1947. The management of the college was handed over to the Devaswom department on 8-11-1948. With the integration of the Travancore and Cochin states on 1-7-1949, Cochin Devaswom was placed

under a Board and control of the college was vested with the Board.

After the formation of Kerala State in 1956, the college got affiliated to the Kerala University. Subsequent to the establishment of University of Calicut on 23-7-1968, our college became affiliated to it. The college celebrated its Silver Jubilee in the year 1972-73 and the Golden Jubilee in the year 1997-98. 2007-08 was the Diamond Jubilee year of the college. The college celebrated its "Saptathi"; in 2018. During this academic year the college is celebrating its 75th Diamond Jubilee.

Now the college is a leading educational institution in our state. There are seventeen Degree courses and eleven Post Graduate courses and four departments offers Ph.D. In 2018 January the college was awarded the grade 'B++' by the National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC).

COLLEGE VISION AND MISSION

Vision : The motto "Asthu Vrittam Subham Sada" (Pure be my Life for Ever) envisaged by the former Maharajah of Cochin, is the vision leading light and constant source of inspiration. The college endeavours to preserve the best traditions of liberal higher education, ensuring full freedom of expression to encounter multifarious ideological preoccupations. In both curricular and co-curricular activities, the college aims at bringing out the best talents of the students.

Mission : The college has taken up the mission with full commitment to bring up the students hailing from semi urban and rural areas, with poor socio-economic backgrounds, on a par with those from better endowed urban areas. The college seeks to make the students competent to face the challenges of modern world with full confidence and social commitment.

FEE CONCESSION RULES

1. Applicants belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Kudumbis and Christian converts from scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other eligible communities who are bonafide subjects of Kerala are eligible for full fee concession, stipend and lumpsum grant for purchase of books and dress. They will have to produce at the time of admission a certificate of nativity and a certificate of community if the community has not been specified in the S.S.L.C. Book.
2. Applicant belonging to other backward communities who are bonafide subjects of Kerala are eligible for full fee concession provided the income of both their parents / guardian does not exceed Rs. 1,00,000 in the case of seeking admission to the Degree class.
3. Kerala State Scholarship for the Arts and Science courses are available to the students in their first year of study in various courses provided they have secured 50 percent marks and above in their qualifying examination and the annual income of their parents does not exceed Rs. 10,000 for Degree courses. The scholarship are awarded on merit-cum-means basis subject to the number allot-ted each year.

Note :

- (l) Applicants who come under (2) above will have to produce at the time of admission the following certificates.
 - (a) Certificate of Income
 - (b) Certificate of Community
 - (c) Certificate of Nativity

- (ii) Applicants belonging to Scheduled castes, Scheduled Tribes, Kudumbis and Christian converts from Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes need not produce income certificate.
- (iii) Other backward communities must produce an Income Certificate issued by the Village Officer. The income of both the parents must be shown in the form and certified. Certificate of income of the guardian will be accepted only in the case of orphans or in other genuine exceptional cases.
- (iv) Nativity Certificate has to be obtained from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of Deputy Tahsildar.
- (v) Community Certificate has to be obtained from the Tahsildar. (The name of the community should be spelt exactly in the same way as given in the list issued by the Government of Kerala)
- (vi) Application for these concession in the prescribed form must be submitted within 10 days from the date of admission. If this is not done fees will have to be paid.
- (vii) Applicants who do not produce the necessary certificates at the time of admission will not be admitted unless they pay the prescribed fees.

Fee concession under the Scheme of Kumara Pillai Commission Report

Students belonging to both socially and educationally "Backward communities" as well as "Forward communities" are eligible for the grant of fee concession under this scheme. The limit of income of the family of the students for the full the concession will be Rs. 1,00,000 for Degree and PG Courses per annum.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF DISCIPLINE

1. No student shall leave the class room during working hours without the permission of the teacher.
2. No student shall use tobacco or any intoxicant in any form or bubble gum, chewing gum etc., in the college.
3. No student shall enter the college premises if he/she is suffering from any contagious disease. Objectionable behavior even outside college will make them liable to disciplinary action.
4. The student should bring the identity card every day to the college. No duplicate identity card will be issued unless the Principal is personally satisfied that the original is lost. The fine for the issue of duplicate card will be decided by the Principal.
5. Any student who is persistently insubordinate or willfully mischievous or guilty of malpractice or has committed an act of serious indiscipline or who, in the opinion of the Staff Council and Principal has an unwholesome influence on his fellow students may be expelled permanently or removed for a specific period, the reasons thereof recorded in writing.
6. No student shall enter the college premises if he/she is not wearing the collar identity card.
7. Ragging of any kind and any magnitude inside /outside the college campus will lead to disciplinary actions.
8. Smoking, use of drugs, alcohol or peddling drugs in the campus is prohibited.
9. Causing damage to the college/public property by scribbling on walls, graffiti writing, scratching walls / toilets, breaking furniture, lab equipment, damaging fittings and pipes etc. will lead to disciplinary actions.
10. Any ill-treatment, both physical and verbal, based on gender, caste and religion will lead to disciplinary actions.

11. Students shall not be found in the verandah of the office unless they have some business to transact and when they are there for transacting business they shall observe strict discipline
12. Students are forbidden from entering any laboratory or store room except with the permission of the Professor in charge of it.
13. No student shall absent himself from a class without applying for leave. Application for leave should be made to the Principal through the Head/Class teacher by the student in person beforehand except in unavoidable and unforeseen circumstances and the application should be made not later than the day of his/her return to the college.
14. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who repeatedly absent themselves on insufficient grounds.
15. The Rules and Regulations may be explained, altered or augmented as necessity arises from time to time by the college authorities. The ignorance of these rules will not be accepted as excuse for not obeying them.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College Library is a spacious two storey building, housed next to the Administrative Block. The library has over 1,00,000 books, subscriptions to both online and print periodicals and magazines, back volumes, and access to INFLIBNET and NLIST. The library caters to the staff, students and research scholars affiliated to different departments. The library is equipped with OPAC facility. Reprography services are provided in the Co-Operative store adjacent to the library building.

Working Hours: 9.00 am to 4.00 pm

A. Membership and Borrowing Rights

1. The membership of the library is open to all staff and students of the college.
2. Books will be issued from Monday to Friday between 9.30 a.m.

to 3.30 pm.

3. Degree and Post-graduate students can borrow 4 books and 6 books respectively. These shall be returned within a period of 14 days from the date of issue.
4. Teachers can borrow 4 books at a time and the total number of books in their possession shall not exceed 10.
5. Members of Non-Teaching staff can borrow 2 books at a time
6. The books shall be returned within a period of 14 days from the date of issue.
7. If a reader fails to return the book on the due date, an overdue charge of Re. 1/- per day will be charged.
8. If the due date falls on a college holiday the book may be returned on the following working day without fine.
9. In reckoning fines intervening holidays are not exempted.
10. Absence or illness is no excuse for delay in return of books.
11. Books may be reissued after the loan period. If there is no call for it, at the discretion of the Librarian.
12. The Librarian can recall any book on loan, if it is required in the library urgently even if it is not due for return.
13. At the end of the course, students shall return all books borrowed from the library on the day notified by the Librarian.
14. Members of staff proceeding on long leave / deputation or transferred to Sree Vivekananda College shall return all books borrowed from the library.
15. Sending reminders is not obligatory for the Library.
16. No reader shall take a book or journal or any other material out of the library without having it properly issued to him.

B. Restricted Section

1. Reference / Consultation books and periodicals shall not be lent out of the library.
2. Every reader using the reference section of the library shall re-

turn the books consulted to the Library Assistant at the reference section, before leaving the library.

3. Staff of the library, working in reference section will assist readers in locating information and sources on the subject of their study.
4. Reader in possession of periodicals, reference books etc. should pass them on to any other reader who may require to use them when such a request is made through any of the library staff members.
5. If a reader wants any pages of a book/periodical to be photo-copied he should contact the Librarian/Assistant Librarian for permission.

C. Cost of Damaged / Lost books

1. If any book is damaged or lost by the borrower he/she shall either replace it or pay the cost. In case of replacement, the book shall be of the same or later edition.
2. The price of rare/out of print book will be determined by the competent authority and it shall be paid by the person responsible for the damage or loss of the book.
3. If a volume from a multi volume set is lost or damaged the price of the whole set will be charged, unless the volume of the set lost can be obtained separately, in which case the cost of the particular volume alone will be recovered.

D. General Instructions

1. Every reader entering the Library should sign the visitors register kept for the purpose at the entrance gate of the library. They are also required to show, on demand, their identity cards to the Library Assistant at the entrance.
2. Personal books are not allowed in the library.
3. Readers are not allowed to take their belongings inside the library.
4. All articles being taken out of the library are subject to inspec-

tion at the exit gate.

5. It is the responsibility of the borrowers to keep their ID Cards in safe custody. If it is lost, it should be reported immediately to the Librarian. Duplicate tickets will be issued within a period prescribed by the Librarian on payment of a fixed amount.
6. Writing or making any kind of mark in the books/periodicals is forbidden.
7. Cutting or tearing of any photo or page from any publication is prohibited.
8. Students must, on receiving books examine them and report to the librarian any damage found therein. If they fail to do so they will be held responsible for the damage found on returning the book.

All complaints and suggestions should be made in writing to the librarian.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

The College provides hostel facilities for men and women. The women's hostel is situated within the college campus and men's hostel is in a short distance from the college campus near the NDS stadium complex of the college. Women's hostel provides accommodation for nearly 220 students and men's hostel for nearly 120 students.

PTA

The Parent Teacher Association of Sree Kerala Varma College, Thrissur has been actively involved in providing financial assistance to students, to participate in the Youth Festivals, Sports & Games etc. It further encourages students who excel in academic fields, by giving cash awards. The PTA is also keen on maintaining discipline and developing student facilities in the college.

COLLEGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

College Development Committee has been constituted for looking after the overall developments of this college. President, Cochin

Devaswom Board is the president of the committee and Principal is the Ex-officio secretary. The members of the committee include members of teaching and non teaching staff, representatives of the parents. Old students Association, the engineering wing of the Cochin Devaswom Board and the College Union Chairman. The Committee started functioning in the year 1999 and as its first venture a centralized library block was constructed making use of the liberal donation from parents, teachers, nonteaching staff and well wishers of the College. The M.P. fund of late. Sri. V.V. Raghavan and C K Chandrappan was utilized for the construction of the main auditorium of the campus, the V.V. Raghavan Auditorium.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

National Service Scheme is Community service programme sponsored by the Ministry of Education & Social Welfare, Govt. of India. There are two NSS units functioning in this college.

Aims and Objectives

The objectives of the National Service Scheme are to create social conscience among the students and to provide him/her with opportunity.

1. To work with/among people;
2. To engage in creative and constructive social action;
3. To enhance his/her knowledge of himself/herself and the community;
4. To put his/her scholarship to practical use in mitigating at least some of the problems;
5. To gain skill in the exercise of democratic leadership;
6. To gain skills in programme development to enable him/ her for self-employment;
7. To bridge the gulf between the educated and the uneducated masses; and
8. To promote the will to serve the weaker section of the community.

Terms of NSS

A student enrolled in NSS is expected to put in at least 120 hours of social service in an academic year and shall be entitled to get a certificate from the University/College/Institution on completion of 2 years term i.e. 240 hours including 10 days special camp.

National Cadet Corps

Over the last 41 years National Cadet Corps has developed into the premier youth organisation in the country. Today it has established itself as a variable auxiliary to the education system. The corps is engaged in character building of the student community, as a National investment for the future. 7 Kerala Girl's Battalion NCC, Thrissur of the Kerala and Lakshadweep Directorate and 24 Kerala Battalion NCC (Boys) are functional in the college.

- Cadets are given intensive training in order to appear for the 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations in the second and third years respectively.
- Cadets are given an opportunity to attend various camps at the state level as well as the national level including Republic Day Camp [RDC], Tal Sainik Camp [TSC], National Integration Camp [NIC], and Annual Training Camp.
- They are given a chance to take part in Adventure Based Learning camps including Mountaineering Expeditions and All India Trekking Expeditions.

IGNOU STUDY CENTRE

The Thrissur study centre of India Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) was opened in 1990 in the college campus. The IGNOU centre on campus has a strength of over 2000 students. The centre offers around 39 undergraduate programmes including various B.A programmes, B.Com, BDT and close to 11 Masters level programmes including MBA, Masters Degree in tourism and several other diploma and certificate programmes. On an average, about 10-15 courses are added every year catering A reference library

and a buffer stock of course materials are maintained at the study centre for the use of the students.

CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETY

The college has a Co-Operative society catering to the needs of the staff and students. The Society offers the following services: sale of books, provisions and office stationary, reprography services, university forms.

The society is managed by a committee elected by the members. Membership is open to all members of staff of the college. It issues loans to members and accepts deposits in the form of fixed deposits and monthly deposits schemes.

One representative each of 1st D.C., 2nd D.C. and 3rd D.C. for professional colleges, one representative for each year - elected by the students of the respective classes and one representative elected by all the P.G. Students (Training college subject group wise)

The Vice Chairperson and the joint Secretary in mixed colleges shall be reserved for ladies. If girl students are not willing to contest in the election these offices shall be kept vacant. The number of councilors shall be one in the colleges having strength less than 1000 and shall be two where the strength is 1000 and above. Officers 2 to 9 shall be filled by election by the students of the college. The election procedure for all the seats shall be the same.

C.G.P.C.

A Career Guidance and Placement Cell (CGPC) has been functioning in the college since 2004. The cell provides students with information related to various avenues of higher education. Students are regularly notified about various employment opportunities. Campus recruitments are also arranged.

REMEDIAL TEACHING

Sree Kerala Varma College successfully conducts UGC remedial coaching programme for each academic years. A remedial coaching committee was formed on 10-11-2015 and prepared the entire plan and time table. The committee has divided the class hours and 192 hours for PG and 112 hours for UG programmes, and selected the faculty members from each department. Maximum priority was given to the students belonging to the SC, ST, OBC and OEC categories. The Remedial Coaching sessions follow a time table set for its specific purpose.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

The College provides hostel facilities for men and women. The women's hostel is situated within the college campus and men's hostel is in a short distance from the college campus near the NDS stadium complex of the college. Women's hostel provides accommodation for nearly 220 students and men's hostel for nearly 120 students.

SPORTS AND CULTURAL CELL

Sports and Cultural Cell of the College has contributed a lot to the

college in the past few decades. The college was able to produce a good number of eminent sports personalities and top figures in the field of arts & culture through this cell.

D-ZONE AND INTERZONE

Every year Sree Kerala Varma College wins prizes at Calicut University D-Zone and Interzone Arts Festivals. The input and involvement of the college union in the above festivals are worth mentioning.

HEPSN

Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs, Helps students with Special Needs and enables them with requires health and assistance provides instruments for the studies. Provides basics infrastructure for students with special needs for their studies. It also helps studies by arranging scribes for their Exams.

WOMEN'S CELL

University Grants Commission (UGC) recommends the measures for ensuring the safety of women and programs for gender sensitization on campuses. According to the task force appointed by UGC, the recommendations include the need for setting up Women's Development Cell and Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell at colleges and universities.

The Women's Cell at Sree Kerala Varma College is a body of eight lady teachers, presided by the Principal. It organizes seminars, workshops, sensitization camps and so on for the students of the campus on a regular basis.
